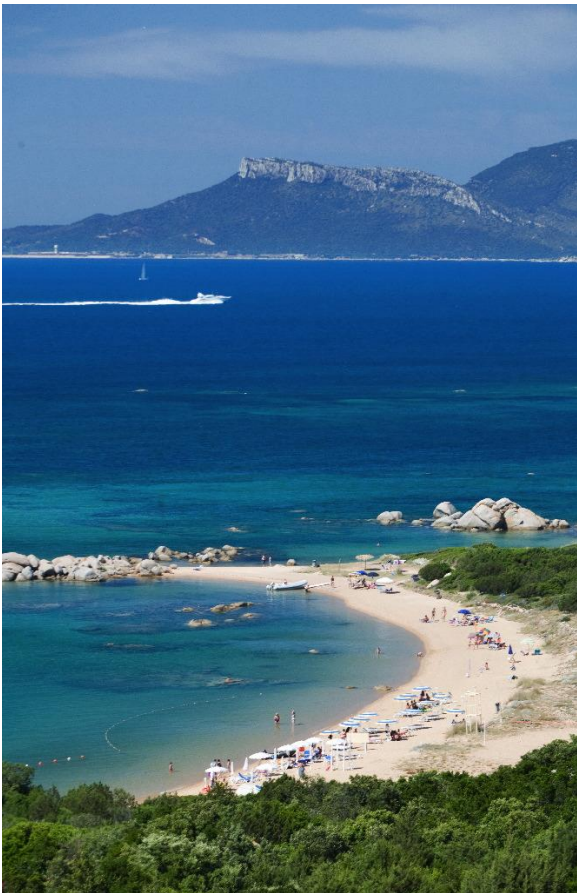


NATURE AND CULTURE: THE TAVOLARA FILM FESTIVAL



The beautiful northwest coast of Sardinia is famous for its unspoilt nature and the spectacular beaches. In the month of July on the Tavolara island, facing the coast of North West of Sardinia, took place the 20th edition of the "Italian Film Festival of Tavolara". The festival was as usual packed with events and screenings all included in the magnificent environment of the Island.

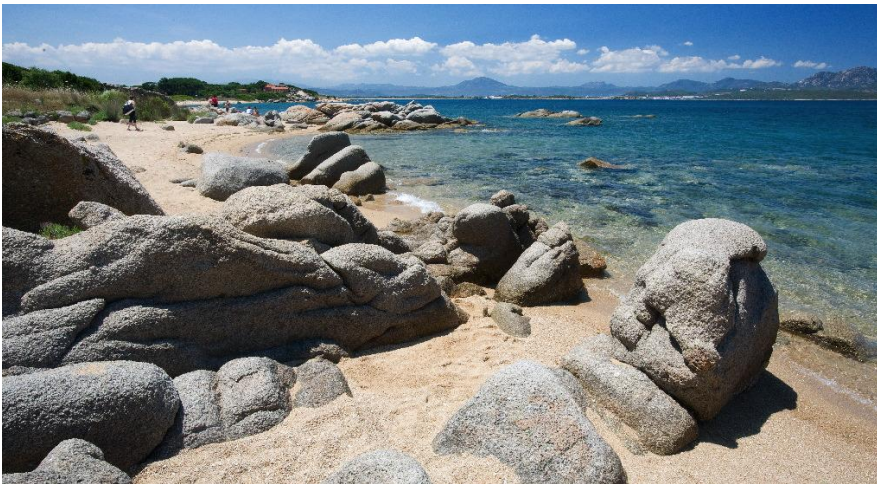
The festival "A Night in Italy", founded in 1991, by a group of friends and lovers of Tavolara and of the seventh art, has followed closely for years, the production and the



history of Italian cinema, involving in its development authors and interpreters. The festival has always retained the same prerogatives: a lot of Italian cinema, sometimes

mistreated by the most important distribution channels, the same unique setting and the desire to assert that a good environment of inestimable value as the Tavolara island can be enjoyed with proposals that combine perfectly landscape protection and tourism. With a space traditionally dedicated to the Sardinian cinema and in particular to young directors or significant works of the regional landscape. The activities of the festival has always emphasized the environmental enhancement of the island and has also helped the establishment of protected marine reserve. The protected marine area stretches along the coast of north-west Sardinia from Cala Finocchio to Capo Ceraso and includes the islands of Tavolara, Molarra and Molarotto.

In the development of its course the event has enriched with a packed program of activities, and has always lived up with the prerogative of great event, during which the public and professionals come together, without filter, on the same boat and in the same auditorium.



Tavolara is reached through a public ferry that, during the festival, provides a run after each screening, late into the night.

The size attained by the event, its credibility at the national level and the

quality of journalists and experts involved, making it one of the festivals most exposed on the media at the national level.

The Tavolara island is a tourist spot of absolute obligation, not only for the film festival but also for its wonderful natural heritage. Tavolara Island is a real limestone peak planted in the Tyrrhenian Sea which can be reached during the day with the boats that depart from Porto San Paolo (16 Km south of Olbia) every half hour.
