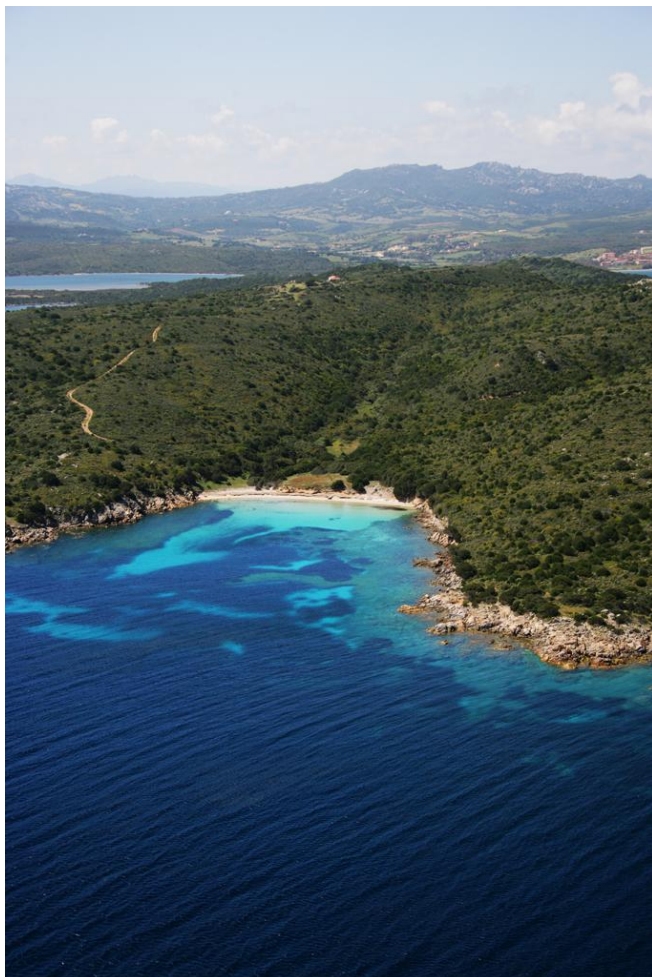
beachfront property, so called because they enjoy exclusive view of La Maddalena archipelago and the islands.

The coast of **Palau** and in particular the **bays of Porto Pollo**, however, are famous throughout the world for the extraordinary natural environment and climate that provides the perfect wind and sea conditions suitable for all water sports you can indeed enjoy windsurfing, kitesurfing and sailing throughout the year with all conditions of wind and safely.



Porto Pollo is located in the north of Sardinia, in front of **Corsica**, between **Palau** and **Santa Teresa di Gallura** and is a large cove of white sand surrounded by

Mediterranean maquis near the mouth of the **River Liscia** and the **Isle of Gabbiani**, connected to the mainland by a thin strip of sand. The feature that makes this area ideal for these sports is to offer good exposure to winds from the northwest quadrant (Tramontana, Maestrale and Ponente).



The **Isle of Gabbiani** (or peninsula) is surrounded by two large bays: the West Bay, located upwind, is usually characterized by **slight wave** (the surfer's parlance is called "chop") and constant wind, provided that you get too close to the coast. The East Bay, located downwind, is close to the bay of Porto Pollo, and has, instead, flat-water conditions and wind gusts. The seabed of



the two bays is sandy and characterized by clear water.

The sandy beaches, rocky coves sheltered, clear waters and emerald green, the colors and smells **Mediterranean maquis** rich of mastic and cistus, are characteristic of this part of the northern coast of Sardinia.

A fantastic setting of granite sculptures shaped by wind and, at sunset, take warm colors, from yellow to pink to red, make this area very attractive.

The **sailing boat trips** allow you to enjoy, from particular points of view, the entire coast and surrounding beaches and in the clearest day, of various parts of the archipelago. Walking along the beaches of **Porto Pollo you will find an absolute harmony of sea, land and vegetation.**
